




## In Oregon, older certificate holders experience a sharp decline in earnings & then a gradual recovery




Among undergrads, older students largely enroll i certificate and associate's de programs

## New rules for our modern economy



- **1** Education level matters
- 2 Majors matter more
- Earnings vary greatly within majors
- Less education can be worth more
  - Humanities and liberal arts majors never catch up in earnings

#### IMPLICATIONS FOR POLICY & PRACTICE

#### What we know about adult learners

- Growing proportion of today's students
- Prior work experience
- Wide variety of postsecondary experiences
- Absolutely critical to reaching attainment goals

#### Questions to ask about all credentials

- How much does the program cost?
- Does the credential lead students to jobs?
- Are those jobs related to the field of study?
- How much do workers with the credential earn?

## Policy recommendations

- Build student pathways from certificate programs to associate's and bachelor's degree programs
- Increase transparency about postcollege outcomes, including employment and earnings
- Collect data on pre- and post-college earnings, at least at the state level
- Tailor student aid to different types of students
